TUMPOT Conferences of the Past

Conference participants indicated a high level of satisfaction with aggregate averages on a five-point scale indicating things such as: Participants learned valuable information that will enhance their mounted job performance (average = 4.3);

Participants learned concrete tools that can be applied to their mounted patrol skills to do their jobs more effectively(average =

5.0);

Participants enhanced their understanding of preventing training issues and learned valuable tools to stop and correct common issues such as rearing, bucking and refusal to comply when lights, sirens, unusual footing and unfamiliar terrain are introduced with artificial stimuli. (average=4.4);

Participants learned new information about equine eyesight, body structure and nutrition to keep the mounted police/SAR horse fit and in proper working condition (average=4.2);

The knowledge gained will enhance services that are provided to the Departments the general public (average=4.3).

Participants also provided numerous comments supporting their overall positive experiences.

The success of the conference was due in large part to the valuable In-put from students, contracted providers, and the dedication of the training staff who are committed to Mounted always!
